- Make sure you get me your vaccination papers. I'll send out an email with everything you need for show day.

Rabbit/Cavy – Lisa Ralph

- Keep animals cool. Hot days on their way.
- For fair you will need to provide your own food and water dishes, your feed. The cages will be set up by Club. Displays must have ventilation. No solid displays will be accepted. we will supply Frozen water bottles.
- All animals on the day of check-in need to come through to the back of the barn. No animals can enter the front of the barn on check-in day. All animals must be checked by myself in order to enter.

- Animals with any visible signs of disease or other issues will be unable to enter.
- All animals must be tattooed in the left ear. This tattoo must be visible and readable. If your animal as of now is not tattooed and planning to be shown at Fair, you must call me as soon as possible to get that done. No animal will be allowed on the grounds without a tag. This includes the guinea pigs. They get a really cute little earring that goes in their ear and if it's not there they will not enter.
- Please bring your animals clean with nails clipped and free from manure and urine. I will be checking in between 50 and 70 rabbits and I would like to try to stay as clean as I can.

Large Beef – Haven Bouwens

 - Need Bio and 4x6 Photos ASAP (email or hard copy)
- Record Books - on the website
 - Should be able to have most of the information filled out by now
- Barn Setup/Decorations
 - Stall Mats are highly encouraged as the cattle will be standing on concrete all week
 - Fans recommended and need to be hung at the head of the animal
 - Rules
 - Only Club Signs and awarded banners can be hung from the rafters.
 - Club Signs must run parallel with the walkway.
 - All other decorations must be attached to the 2x10 board at the head of each stall
 - Note: try to keep all decorations out of reach from your animals.
- Unloading
 - Must have your RDIF Tag and Livestock Council tag in ear, and have both health forms
 - Only animals, neckties, and water buckets should be unloaded at that time. No Chutes, tack or decorations.
- Schedule updates
 - Saturday weight in - min weight 1000
 - Saturday Heifer CIDRs - After barn meeting
 - Sunday - TWO Mandatory Handling Practices. If you can't make it let us know ASAP
 - Tuesday - Open starts at 8am
 - Wednesday - Large beef start at 9am
 - Wednesday Photos - 2:30

- Thursday - Auctioning after swine
- Grooming Chutes
 - Please wait to setup chutes in the washrack until Monday evening as we will need the washrack space for handling practice on Sunday and Monday.
 - Electricity is limited, if you plan to bring your own chute a generator may be needed.
 - Tuesday - Wednesday we will have access to the paved path. This should allow room for everyone who would like to bring their chute.
 - After the show on Wednesday we will need all chutes moved. we ask that only 1 chute per club is set up in the wash rack after that.

Poultry – Lynn Henning

- Set up is Thursday, no decorations hung until then.
- 2 health forms are required at unloading.
- Make sure poultry are clean.

Dairy Beef/Feeder – Greg Bancroft

- All cattle have been tagged.
- Make sure if tags get ripped out contact us ASAP.
- Fill out both health forms.
- Minimum Dairy Beef 1,00lbs.
- Minimum Dairy Feeder 350lbs.

- We will be sending out stall assignments, show bill and more information soon
- A reminder The fair cannot guarantee the sawdust does not have black walnut in it

Lamb – Clayton Porter

- If you are a senior, I need your laminated senior bio as soon as possible.
- Pen Assignments will be sent out as soon as possible. I am still waiting on information from the fair for how many pens we will need for open lambs. NOTE: If you have lambs penned together at home, please respond to the email with that information so I can figure out who can pen together and who needs to be in their own pen. We have a lot more lambs this year and we will have over 20 pens that will need to double up.
- Barn Decorating will start Wednesday July 30th from 4-9pm and continue at the same times Thursday and Friday. Any decorations hung before that date will be taken down due to sanitization of the barn. Please wait until Wednesday. Ensure that your decorations are light and adjustable for height if needed.
- Education posters, if you have made them please bring them next week during barn decorating so I can work to get them posted for fair week. This is not mandatory, but we

are trying to increase the education in our barn to the general public. We are hoping to make this a competition in the barn for next year as well.

- **LEATHER FOOTWEAR-** Closed-toed leather footwear must be worn at all times when you are working with or feeding and watering your lamb(s). This is for parents as well, if you are helping your youth, please no sandals. Rubber boots are ok for washing your lamb.
- **Unloading Saturday Aug 2nd-** Lambs can start checking in and unloading at 10AM and goes until 12pm. Please enter through the main fair gate and go to gate 4 (pit gate) then you will go right and follow the dirt road behind the carnival rides, you will continue behind the goat, llama, poultry and rabbit barns. **Please do not unload your lamb(s) until asked to do so.** We will do our health check and collect **2 health forms for each lamb being unloaded.** (Health forms are attached via email or can be found on our website) If you don't have the 2 health forms the lamb(s) and you cannot unload and you will be asked to make a loop and get back in line. IF you Lamb(s) don't have a scrapies tag in the ear then you cannot unload your lamb and be asked to leave, the scrapies tag is required by law. If you are having issues meeting the drop off time, you need to call me as soon as possible. Do not wait until 11:45 am to call me to let me know that you can't get your lamb loaded or you are having vehicle troubles. Call me early and we will work to get someone to come help you. The earlier we know, the more likely we can accommodate your situation.
- Once you have unloaded your lamb(s) please promptly exit gate 1, which is past the pig barn straight ahead and to the right. **No tack or feed will be unloaded at time of unloading.** Please have your pen ready the night before with sawdust and water buckets and hay or feed or walk to the barn after unloading.
- **Market Weight in-** We will weigh lambs at 1pm in the back of the lamb barn. There will be no reweighs. **For anyone that tagged a 2nd lamb, you will have to choose your market lamb before your lamb steps on the scale.** Anyone that wants to weigh their show only or cloverbud lamb, we ask that you let the market lambs go first.

Jr Beef – Amanda Wilkens

- Program/ Schedule Changes:
Auction Line up Lottery: This Year we will place the top 15 Steers and Top 15 Heifers.

- The rest of the lineup will be placed by a lottery draw.
- All Market participants will draw a random number at weight in.
- Due to smaller animal size and lower numbers. Everyone will go back in for final line up like before, we will just be placing 1-15. 16-28 will be a lotto draw.

- Barn meeting time change: Barn meeting will be at 4:30pm in the wash rack

- Show day Changes:
 - Tuesday: Open Shows will start at 8am, 4-H Market will follow the open shows.
 - Wednesday: 4-H showmanship will start at 9am with a new order large beef will go first followed by Large Dairy, Dairy Feeders, Jr. Beef.
- Cattle pictures will also be on Wednesday this year (see fair schedule for change). All Market kids are required to get a picture taken. Non-Market and Cloverbuds may have their pictures taken and purchased online for \$12.

- Decorations:
 - Decorations can start going up on Wednesday July 30th starting at 4pm when campers can start coming out. Pen assignments will be done by Monday evening, July 28th.
- Ensure that club decorations and signs do not block airflow to your animals or those around you.
 - No lights, of any type, are allowed as part of the decorations (see page 30 of the P&P Book)
- Livestock council issued stall cards need to be posted in the pens before the fair opens on Sunday. White for market and green for show only.
- Make sure your pens are ready to go with decorations, Stall mat or board and Sawdust before the animals arrive on Saturday August 2nd.

- Saturday Arrival: Cattle can arrive on the grounds starting at 7 a.m. All cattle need to be on the ground by 11am. Only cattle, Neck ties and water buckets if not already in the stall can be unloaded at this time.

- Enter gate 4 of the main parking lot, turn at the fair office and follow the road down to the cattle barn. You will unload between the calf barn and large beef barn. You will then exit through gate 1. All traffic is one way in and out. There is no turning at the calf barn to go to the campground area. You must go back around.
- Seniors, if I have not gotten you picture an bio can you please send that to me ASAP. It is highly recommended to disinfect your supplies before you bring them to the fair.
 - Make sure you are getting your buyers' letters out.
 - Reach out with any questions.

- I am sure everyone is practicing and ready for fair!
- Check in is 11am-2pm on Saturday, enter gate 4 & out gate 2.
- Please have 2 health forms completed and ready to turn in at check in or you wont be able to unload.
- Barn meeting is at 5pm.

1. Any Updates:
 - a. Seniors- please send your 5x7 and bios to me at the swine barn email- name, 4H group, High school, the impact 4H had on you, and finally your Future plans.
 - b. Swine Barn Youth Leadership- we have met three times this year and youth input to leading the barn has been awesome! This group will lead the bulletin board creations/designs, set up for shows, and lead special Swine Barn activities. If you're interested being part of this group in the future and in helping set up and run the Swine Barn, email Jen at swinebarn4H@gmail.com!
 - c. Make sure you're deworming your projects, watch the labels/talk to your vet about withdrawal times- this is the amount of time needed between the working and going to the processor. Update your health record with any vaccinations and dewormers and any other medications used.
 - d. Load in- 6am-10am, must be in line in the fairgrounds to make weigh in. Call me early if you're having trouble loading...so we can help and you make it in time! Min Weight is 225lbs and max weight is 315lbs. The swine that weighs is the swine that stays!!
 - e. Waterers- each 4Her bringing a swine is responsible for bringing a waterer to fair and providing clean/fresh water at all times. Most choose to make a self waterer and a few choose to bucket fresh water. Let me know if you need instructions on a Do It Yourself waterer to build at home and bring to fair.
 - f. Tags- 840 tags must be present in pig's ear at all times - if missing, please contact your breeder for a new tag and update me by email with old tag number and replacement number.
 - g. Reminder - Any decorations including club signs or 4Her fair signs hung above your fair pens must have air flow. If you have questions, please let Todd know!
 - h. Mandatory swine barn meeting LOCATION change! Haberlein at 6:30pm. Thanks to the Swine youth Leaders for their input to have our meeting in a shadier spot! Bring a chair if needed.
 - i. Show schedule: DA will be on Sunday at 10-10:30am. The rest of the shows will be Monday only- Breed, then Showmanship oldest to youngest, Cloverbuds, then Market. We will take the judge's recommendations about break times between shows. Once

known, we will update swine families.

j. Special events-

i. Tuesday 1pm Swine Barn- The Ultimate Rock Paper Scissors Tournament!
Prizes for the GRAND Champ as well as the top 15.
