Leelanau County (Rosali Collier) -

4-H Tractor Safety Program: MSU Extension/Leelanau 4-H will host an in-person 4-H Tractor Safety Program for 14 and 15-year-old youth on Sundays, April 30, May 7, and May 21 from 3:00-5:00 pm at the NW MI Horticulture Research Center (between Suttons Bay and Traverse City on County Rd 633). The written and driving test will be held in-person, by appointment, on Sunday, June 4 between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. Rain date will be Sunday, June 11. Participants must attend all four days to become certified. The cost is \$60 per student, which includes the classes, manual, certificate, and snack on testing day. Some scholarships are available if finances are an issue. Youth must be 14 years of age by June 1, 2023. Space is limited to 20 youth. The registration deadline is April 21, 2023. Registration is online-only in a two-step process. First, register and pay at <https://events.anr.msu.edu/TractorSafety2023/>, and second, become a 4-H member with Leelanau County and create a family account online at <https://v2.4honline.com/>, choosing the Tractor Safety program as their club. Once registered, participants will receive more information about signing up for

- **Goat – Robin Gildner**

Possession date is May 1st. Start preparing for your project to come home now. It is a good idea to print the goat health form off the livestock council website and take it with you when you pick up your goat. That way you can ask all of the questions you will need to know. Be sure your project has a scrapie tag already in the ear or that the breeder provides you with one, and that the corresponding numbers are tattooed in their ears. If your project is registered, you will need a pedigree from an accredited association.

There are currently: 49 youth registered, 13 market, 14 cloverbuds.

Updated record books have been uploaded to the livestock council website. Start them early and don't forget your beginning pictures.

Two tagging dates will take place at the back of the goat barn on the fairgrounds:

May 13th, 10am – 12pm

May 28th 10am – 12pm

If you drop the Jr. Beef program, please let me know as I am working on a tagging schedule based on the numbers we currently have.

Possession date is May 15th. You can tag an extra calf for \$10 and the calf may only be used within the family that tagged it.

Calves are starting to be born, make sure you are on a list with a breeder. 100% Beef breeds (Angus, Chi, Hereford, etc. or a cross of beef breeds), No dairy crosses. Smaller breeds such as Dexter and Highland Cattle should only be used for cloverbud or show only participants, as they do not meet the standards for the large beef program and many market Jr. Beef will go to youth in the large beef program.

Calves must be born after January 1st. Make sure you get an RFID tag from breeder.

Vaccines: when you pick up your calf ask if it has been vaccinated and make sure to take a health record form with you, if the breeder vaccinated the calf you will need to get the vaccine information for the health record. If your calf was not vaccinated, it will be your responsibility to vaccinate your calf for Bovine Rhinotracheitis (IBR), Parainfluenza 3 (PI3), and Bovine Respiratory Syncytial Virus (BRSV) before unloading at fair.

All the record books and policy and procedures have been updated and uploaded to the website for the 2023 year.

As we get closer to fair, be conscious of withdrawal dates. This is a good time to do a check on feed/rations. Your project should have doubled in size by now and will be eating considerably more.
