- Calves must be born after January 1st .
 - Make sure you are getting your pens ready and disinfected for your new project.
 - Check your pen for hazards like protruding nails that could injure your calf.
 - Make sure you have enough bedding as the weather has been a roller coaster lately.
 - Must be beef breeds or cross between beef breed (no Dairy/Beef Crosses)
Smaller/Mini breeds such as dexter and highland cattle may only be used for cloverbud and show only projects, as they cannot be used in the large beef program.
 - Make sure as you are picking up your projects that they have an RFID tag from the farm you are purchasing it from. RFID tags are a state requirement to move cattle in Michigan.
 - When picking up your calf make sure to ask about vaccinations, if the breeder has done this already you will need to get the information for the health record.
 - Reminder for market projects there is a min weight of 300lbs and a max weight of 700lbs
 - Tagging will take place in June.
 - You can tag an extra calf for \$10 due at the time of tagging.
 - I will also have tags at the 2 June practices
 - If your calf is not housed at the address that is on your 4-H online, if you could please send me the address of where your calf is located.
 - Summer practices:

 - With the weather looking to warm up slightly, it's a good time to start putting weight on because their bodies won't be working so hard to try and keep warm.
 - If your steer is looking to finish around 1200 lbs they should be ideally 900-950 lbs

- Swine Barn Youth Leadership- if you're interested in helping set up and run the Swine Barn, email me! We're looking for youth to lead the bulletin board creations/designs, set up for shows, and lead special Swine Barn activities. See the monthly newsletter for more details.
- We will have a Show Clinic for Swine Sunday, May 18th, 2pm-4pm. This clinic will be a full Hands On How To for showing- for moving your project, being in the right place at the right time, show line up, holding pens and the Final Run for Top 15. More details to come. Watch your emails and Facebook page for Sign up! This will count as an education credit as well this will be held at the Fairgrounds at the haberline area.
- Spend time with your project, sit in the pen, brush them, talk to them- this will get your project used to you. Start practicing with your project- walking around the stall, and outside weather permitting. Look up YouTube videos for help with how to train your project to walk and show.
- Weigh or Tape measure your project weekly to make sure it is gaining weight like it should. A 50 pound pig with 115 days until fair, must gain at least 1.5# per day, or 10.5# per week to make the minimum fair weight of 225#... weighing or taking your project will help you adjust feed to get to your target swine weight for fair.
- Swine superintendent Todd Brown would like everyone to know that any club signs or 4-Her fair signs hung above your stalls must have air flow, and cannot be vinyl banners per our policies and procedures. If you have questions, please let Todd know.

- Possession Date By May 1st, 2025

Lamb – Clayton Porter

- It's that time of year! Everyone should be getting their lambs. If you still haven't gotten with a breeder, see our breeder list on our Facebook page or the livestock council page, and schedule that asap. Possession date is May 1st.
- The weather has not been favorable so make sure you are keeping your lambs dry with plenty of fresh bedding, keep them well fed and have plenty of fresh water.
- Things to remember when picking up sheep:
 - Have feed prior to, check with your breeder so you can change gradually if you're changing feed.
 - Collect medication and worming information from your breeder for your medical records.
- Reach out with any questions or concerns.
- Start record books as soon as you get your lambs.
- Birth Date was changed to December 1st, but getting an older lamb comes with new challenges so do your homework and be prepared.
- Coming soon:
 - Virtual tagging coming in the next couple of weeks.
 - Shearing/fitting clinics will be scheduled in June.
- Start gathering supplies now, be prepared, and don't be afraid to reach out with any questions or concerns.

Rabbit/Cavy – Lisa Ralph

- Registration due by May 5th.
- Market possession date and registration cut off is May 5th.
- Breeding dates for pens of three is April 26th. The buck in the doe must be in your possession.
- Just watch the weather and make sure your animals are on a draft-free area.
- If your animal seems thin after this winter, try adding some sunflower seeds, oatmeal and some calf manna to help put weight back on.

Poultry – Lynn Henning

- Watch the weather, prepare for the arrival of birds. Heat lamps, proper feed, water, wood flakes and a cage/ or draft free critter free.
- Poultry is being ordered through tractor supply. Thank you for your prompt orders. I will email and text you when your birds arrive. Pick up and pay within 24 hours at the Chum's Corner store.

- Start Spending more time with your animals to continue to build their trust.
- If you are entering the pack classes please start practicing by laying a folded towel over their back gently.
- Registrations can be filled out anytime, but are due by the next meeting, May 5th by 11:59PM.
- Our one clinic will be June 22 at the fairgrounds from 5-7 PM and will focus on the pack class. We can talk about showmanship and obstacle classes if needed as well.

Goat – Robin Gildner

- Registration is closed. We have 45 registered participants, with 16 market goats.
- Possession date is coming up quickly, May 1st.
- Projects must be born after Nov. 1st 2024. Ideally you are looking for a December or January born kid so that they are not over conditioned or past their prime come fair time.
- If you are struggling to find a project yet feel free to reach out to me and I can help you locate one.
- If you have brought your project home already or will be here soon, please keep a close eye on them for sickness, with this weather being so all over the place right now you need to be paying extra attention to them.
- Minimum weight for market projects is still 65 pounds.
- You can tag a backup market project for a \$10 fee, due at tagging.
- Make sure your project has its official USDA scrapies tag in its ear or tattooed with the full tag number. Registration tattoos are also accepted with a copy of the pedigree. With either option when the tag is not physically in the goats ear you will need to provide the physical scrapie tag with the health paperwork at check in the first day of fair.
- Just a reminder, we have confirmed a show time change for our 4-H shows on Tuesday during fair week. We will start at 9am now.
