OLD BUSINESS:

- a. Drop Off Review
 - i. Times – please note time changes on Fair Schedule (schedule can be found on the Livestock Council website)
 - ii. Traffic Pattern – All traffic will enter Gate 4 (see schedule on the Livestock Council website for details pertaining to each specific specie)
 - iii. Health Forms – 2 pages, you will NOT be allowed to unload your animals without these forms. (Both the Livestock Council Form and the Fair Form can be found on the Livestock Council website).
- b. Blood Drive – happening on Tuesday and Friday of Fair. Kathy passed around a sign-up sheet. If we get enough people to donate we will get a kick back toward our program. Any questions, contact Kathy Easter.
- c. Appropriate Footwear – This applies to everyone. There will be signs on the barns. This applies to parents, support persons, volunteers, etc. If you are not wearing appropriate footwear, you will be asked to leave the pen, barn, wash rack, etc. Muck boots are ok when you are washing your animal but will not be allowed for other activities.
- d. Cattle Wash Rack Etiquette – one support person per 4-Her. Appropriate footwear is expected, or you will be asked to leave. If there are too many support people, they will be asked to leave. Once your child goes into the show ring, please exit the wash rack to watch the show and then meet them back in the wash rack when they're done. As soon as your child is finished you should exit the wash rack. Thank you.
- e. Barn Decorations – no decorations can be hung prior to 4pm on Wednesday, July 31st, no exceptions. See your specie chair after the meeting for your pen card. If you lose your pen card or it gets trashed and you need a replacement, there is a \$5 fee.

SPECIE CHAIR UPDATES:

- **Goat – Robin Gildner**

Make sure you read labels for withdrawal periods before administering anything to your market project as we are less than two weeks away from move in day.

 - Check your tags and/or tattoos. Your goat must have a scrapie tag in its ear or have been tattooed with the corresponding numbers from the scrapie tag or

pedigree. If your goat has tattoos (either from the scrapie tag or per the pedigree) please make sure they are legible PRIOR TO FAIR. No tagging or tattooing will be done on the fairgrounds during check in. Per the state vet, you will still need to bring the physical corresponding scrapie per goat and attach it to the Health Form. If you have a pedigreed goat that does not have a scrapie tag in its ear, you will need to supply a COPY of the pedigree along with a physical scrape tag attached to the paperwork. You will get these forms back at the end of fair week.

- Health Forms: There are two health forms on the livestock council website, under the goat specific page, that you will need for check in day. One is the 2024 NWMI Fair Animal Health Plan and the other is the 2024 Goat Health Record.
- Check in for goats is from 10am – 12pm, Saturday Aug. 3rd. You will enter gate 4 and drive around to the back of the goat barn. This road is one way traffic for the day so please stay to the left side of the road (carnival side) so that we form a single file line and other species can still pass to head to their barns. DO NOT unload your goat, keep them on the trailer until you have been instructed to unload. You will then exit out through gate 2, that is at the rear of the goat barn.
- Market Goat weigh in is at 1:30pm. We will meet at the back of the goat barn at 1:15pm and all walk over together to the lamb barn to weigh in.
- NEW this year, our barn meeting time is at 3:30 PM in the Rosa Arena.
- Watch your email for my reminder email with all the goat specific details.

- Turn on the radio and have your rabbits around a lot of noise. The more they are exposed, it will help with stress.

- Workbee Reminder - We have a couple of kids who still need to complete their workbee requirement. The last chance to get this done is tomorrow **Wednesday, July 24th**. If you have not signed up yet please do so using the link below.

- Seniors - We would like to have all senior bios and photos ASAP so we can recognize you on the senior board. Please complete the attached senior bio form and provide a 4x6 senior photo. You can either email an electronic version or turn in a hard copy to Crystal or me.
- Program Change Reminder - The minimum weight for large beef projects has increased from 900 pounds to **1000 pounds** this year. There will be no reweighs allowed at fair.
- Basic Fair Week Supply List:
 - **Fan** - Can be hung above the pens. Please plan to hang your own extension cord and fan. Fans can be mounted to the wall above your pen. We ask that fans are not hung from the rafters. A 10–15-foot extension cord should be long enough to reach. We recommend that these are put up when you do your decorations.
 - **Boards/mat** - These are recommended in pens, there is a solid concrete floor in the barn. If you would like to bring a rubber stall mat to lay down before the sawdust, a 4x8 mat would fit well, or plan to bed heavily with sawdust. Stalls are 4x9. We recommend that these are put up when you do your decorations.
 - **Grooming Chute** - Please feel free to drop your grooming chute off when you are decorating or on Saturday afternoon after weigh-in is complete. Chutes cannot be unloaded when dropping your animal off on Saturday. Please line grooming chutes up along the barn wall in the wash rack. Just like last year

we ask that only one chute per club be set up in the washrack area throughout the week due to limited space. On Tuesday and Wednesday, we will have access to the asphalt pathway again to allow room for additional chutes to be set up. We will have some room next to the open cattle in the draft horse barn where the extra chute can be stored during the week. Please talk amongst your group and decide who will be leaving their grooming chute in the wash rack all week. Please wait to set up your club chute in the washrack until Monday afternoon after the handling practices so we have room to work with animals.

- **Generator** - Electricity is limited, if you plan to bring your own chute a generator may be needed.
 - **Leather Footwear** - Leather footwear must be worn if you're working with your animal, in the stall with your animal, or in the wash rack. This goes for parents and fitters as well. The only expectation is you can have rubber boots when washing.
 - **Show Halter** - For handling practice, Shows, and Auction.
 - **Rope Halter** - For daily use.
 - **Necktie** - Chain or rope necktie, to tie in the stall. I would recommend a 5/16 chain with a threaded quick link if using a chain. We recommend also using a rope halter to tie up for the first few nights as we had a handful of steers/heifers slip their necktie last year.
 - **Feed dish**
 - **Water bucket with a clip** - No loose water buckets in the pens so, please clip water buckets to the provided eye screw.
 - **Hay and Grain** - This will need to be stored at your camper.
 - **Grooming supplies** - brushes, shampoo, etc...
 - **Shovel/ Wheelbarrow/Pitchfork** - This will also need to be stored at your camper. There will be a couple of tack stalls at the end of the barn. If you are willing to leave a wheelbarrow in the barn to share to help keep the barn clean throughout the day that would be appreciated.
 - **Show Cloths** - We have two required 4H shows (market and showmanship) and an Open Show.
 - **Show stick** - Ensure it's in good condition, not bent and free of paint chips
 - **Show comb** - Should have a show comb for show day either in the showman's back pocket or brush holster.
 - **Backtag holder or safety pins** - Backtags will be supplied at the barn meeting
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- **Pen Decorations & Setup (Wed-Fri)** - Please do not begin decorating until Wednesday, as the barns are being sanitized Tuesday evening. Pen assignments will be posted by 8am next Wednesday. Pens must be ready for your animal to arrive on Saturday morning so plan to prepare your pen when decorating. That means pens must be ready with sawdust down so that you can unload and go directly to

your pen. Only animals, neckties, and water buckets should be unloaded at that time, no tack, no chutes, no decorations, etc.

- Decoration Rules:
 1. Only club signs/banners and awarded grand and reserve banners may be hung from the rafters. (No other decorations are allowed on the rafters)
 2. Club signs/banners must be hung securely at no more than 4 feet from the wall over the stall and must run parallel with the walkway (no club signs may be hung over the aisle way)
 3. Make sure that signs and decorations do not block airflow.
 4. Grand and Reserve Banners will be hung from the rafter with provided brackets.
 5. It is the club's own responsibility to hang and remove club signs/banners.
 6. All other decorations will be hung/attached to the 2x8 board at the head of each stall.

- Saturday Unloading - Load-in will be coming in Gate 4 and exiting Gate 1. Only animals, neckties, and water buckets should be unloaded at that time, no tack, no chutes, no decorations, etc. Be sure you have both animal health forms, RFID Tag, and Livestock Tag, and make sure your animal gets water as soon as you put it in the pen.

- Sunday Handling Practice - Please come prepared with your show halters and be at your pen ready to be dismissed by club. Sunday there are two mandatory practices at 8 am and 7 pm. If you have a conflict with these times, please contact Crystal or me before Sunday morning.

Question – personal shutes are ok?

Haven – yes, on show days but please don't leave them in the wash rack.

Question – does DA need to show twice to prove they can handle?

Haven – yes.

Please be sure to read the policy and procedures document. It is best to ensure you are clear on the rules and fitting your lamb(s) for fair.

Minimum weight is 100LBS with no maximum weight required to market at fair. If your lamb happens to not make weight you are responsible to sell your lamb on your own time and no signs can be posted on or at your pen. You will also be responsible for arranging the transportation for the animal, more information will be released for trucking options if you would like to add a lamb to the processing trucks coming.

We will have a sign up Saturday at fair for anyone who needs help Show shearing.

Decorations can start going up on Wednesday July 31st starting at 4pm when campers can start coming out. Pen assignments will be done by the evening of Monday July 29th.

Reminders about decorations.

- Ensure that club decorations and signs do not block airflow to your animals or those around you.

- No lights, of any type, are allowed as part of the decorations
- Have pens/stalls filled with sawdust and ready for the animals before arrival day. Make sure you bring Plywood or stall mats to put under the sawdust, Calf stalls are about 4x7 feet, Boards and stall mats need to go home with you at the end of fair as storage is limited.

Cattle can start to arrive Saturday August 3rd starting at 7a – 11a
 Enter gate 4 and exit gate 1. Unloading between the calf barn and the large beef barn, There will be volunteers helping to direct traffic that morning so follow their direction.

Items needed to unload:

- Livestock Council Tag
- RFID Tag (must be in the calf's ear before coming to fair)
- Jr. Beef Health record with vaccine information on it and signed
- Animal Health agreement signed.

Failure to have any of these items will cause you to have to make the loop again. Make sure if you are not riding with the person that is hauling your animal that you are right behind them and make sure they have all the needed paperwork.

Only the bare minimum may be unloaded during this time your animal, necktie and a bucket for water are the only things that get unloaded. No unloading of grooming cutes, feed etc.

If you are hauling different animals for example, I have a family that will be bring a Jr. Beef and a Lamb so they will be coming closer to 10 you must get in one line the one animal then circle back around and get in the other line to unload the second animal.

Important times:

Weight in is at 1pm or after dairy feeders are complete. Reminder for market animals Min weight is 300 and max weight is 700. The 4-Her is required to take their animal across the scale unless prior arrangements are made with me before Saturday August 3rd.

Show times:

Tuesday:

Open show will begin at 1pm
 4-H market shows will begin 15 minutes following the completion of the open shows

Wednesday:

4-H showmanship will start at 9am. Market requirement you must show your market animal in your assigned showmanship class.

Barn meeting

5:30pm in the wash wrack

Followed by the Mandatory Meeting in the grandstands at 7:30pm

Footwear:

Anytime you are working with your animal or in the stall with your animal you need to have on leather footwear, you can wear rubber boots while washing your animal. This also pertains to your support person helping you get ready for shows.

Make sure you bring everything you need to take care of and show your animal the week of fair. If you are bringing blowers, recommend that you bring a generator as well.

Wash rack :

If you haven't seen yet the wash rack project is coming along. If you are bringing a personal grooming cute, can you please store them at the far end of the wash rack. Please help take care of the wash rack. They have had new hoses and nozzles donated, so please don't leave them laying on the ground please hang them back on the hooks that will be provided. We will talk more about that at the barn meeting.

Stall cards Leaders can get them from me after the meeting was adjourned, keeping in mind that if you forget them or they get ruined before the fair you will have to get a replacement for \$5 charge at the auction trailer. If you don't want them tonight, you can get them at the barn meeting. Also keep in mind that if your calf is underweighting you will need to get the green show only stall card.

1. Updates:

a. Keep up the great work!!

- i. Important to keep your swine cool, using shade, fans - keep air moving!
- ii. They burn easily, so protect them with cover/shelter.
- iii. Ensure they have access to fresh water 24/7.
- iv. Walking and practicing as if you are in the show ring will get your hog ready for the fair!

b. WEIGHTS:

- i. Min weight 225#
- ii. Max weight is 315#
- iii. If you are worried about being underweight or are getting close to being overweight - please consult your feed specialist or vet to ensure you can market your animal at fair!

c. WATERERS at FAIR - there are no water lines that go directly into the pig stalls.

- i. Each swine will need it's own waterer in it's stall.
- ii. If you need the instructions to make the PVC waterer, please let me know and I can email it to you!

d. TAGS: Your 840 tag that you sent on your tagging form is required to be in your pigs ear in order to unload the animal at fair.

- i. Sometimes tags fall out! Make sure to let me know if this happens.
 - 1. Immediately obtain a new tag from your breeder.
 - 2. Send me a text or an email with pictures of tag # out of ear, and new tag so I can update the tagging form for Fair check in

e. Unloading at Fair:

- i. TIME CHANGE THIS YEAR - is Saturday 6-10am.

1. ***You MUST be in line by 10am to unload your swine project at the fair.
2. If you need any help or are struggling to load, call me EARLY so I can work on solutions with you.

ii. HEALTH FORMS -

1. There are 2 required health forms located on the livestock council website, also link to these in the June Swine barn newsletter in your emails.
 2. 2 health forms must be completed prior to unloading and will be collected as you arrive to unload your swine project.
 3. EACH swine project must have it's own health forms.
 4. The TWO REQUIRED HEALTH FORMS are:
 - a. Swine Health Form
 - b. NWMi Fair Animal Health Plan agreement
 - f. WORK BEE - Required for participation in the fair.
- i. The last work bee is this Wednesday 7/24 at 6pm
- ii. I'll be in the swine barn and would love to meet you!
- iii. We will be setting up the swine pens.

g. PEN ASSIGNMENTS -

- i. I have the pen assignments and will email them out to all leaders this week after pens go up this Wednesday.
