Dinner will be provided. These meetings are mandatory for club leaders to attend, provide the needed annual financial documents, and go over mandatory training requirements. **4HOnline Enrollment Time**: All registered 4-H volunteers and 4-H youth should enroll in 4HOnline again for this new 4-H year, starting this Friday the 15th. Remember to choose the county where your primary club is held, even if you don't live in that county. Please go to <a href="https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in">https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in</a> to re-enroll (if you have been a past member) or enroll (if you are a brand-new member). We also have paper forms you can use. A new requirement for your enrollments this year is adding your insurance information. If you do not have insurance, you can just answer N/A. Please reach out to your specific county office for assistance with the enrollment process.

4-H Club Leaders: We must have every club complete the Annual Financial Summary Report by October 15<sup>th</sup> this year—no exceptions. If clubs do not comply with this, the club disbanding process will be started. We 4-H staff want to help you with this and meet this deadline—please reach out to us! Even if your club does not have a bank account, if your club is chartered and has an EIN, you still need to complete this form (with lots of zeroes on it). We also need the signed Civil Rights Compliance form (county specific), as well as a copy of your club minutes from last year (September 1, 2022-August 31, 2023). Each county may have other paperwork for you to fill out, but these three are required by MSU annually in order for your club to be considered active in the system. We also want to remind all clubs that in order to be a club, you must have 5 youth members, from at least two different families. It's very helpful if you let us know that you are ready to take on new members—we can share that with interested families. Leelanau County 4-H Fall Leader Updates: I am doing these one-on-one, by appointment. I will need to meet with one leader from every club in Leelanau, and we will get paperwork filled out and talk about this coming 4-H year. Please reach out to me with good days and times, and we can also arrange how we would like to meet (in-person or on Zoom). Chocolate and thank-you gifts will be provided! We will also be talking about nominating your club members for awards to be shared at the Leelanau County 4-H Awards celebration, which we are holding this winter in conjunction with our annual 4H4ALL event in Maple City at the Lions Club. We basically provide a mini Expo for the public, showing off what our clubs do, have some great food, drink some hot chocolate, give away some free prizes, and then we'll hold our awards celebration. Save that date of Sunday, January 14<sup>th</sup> from 2-5 pm. All are welcome!


